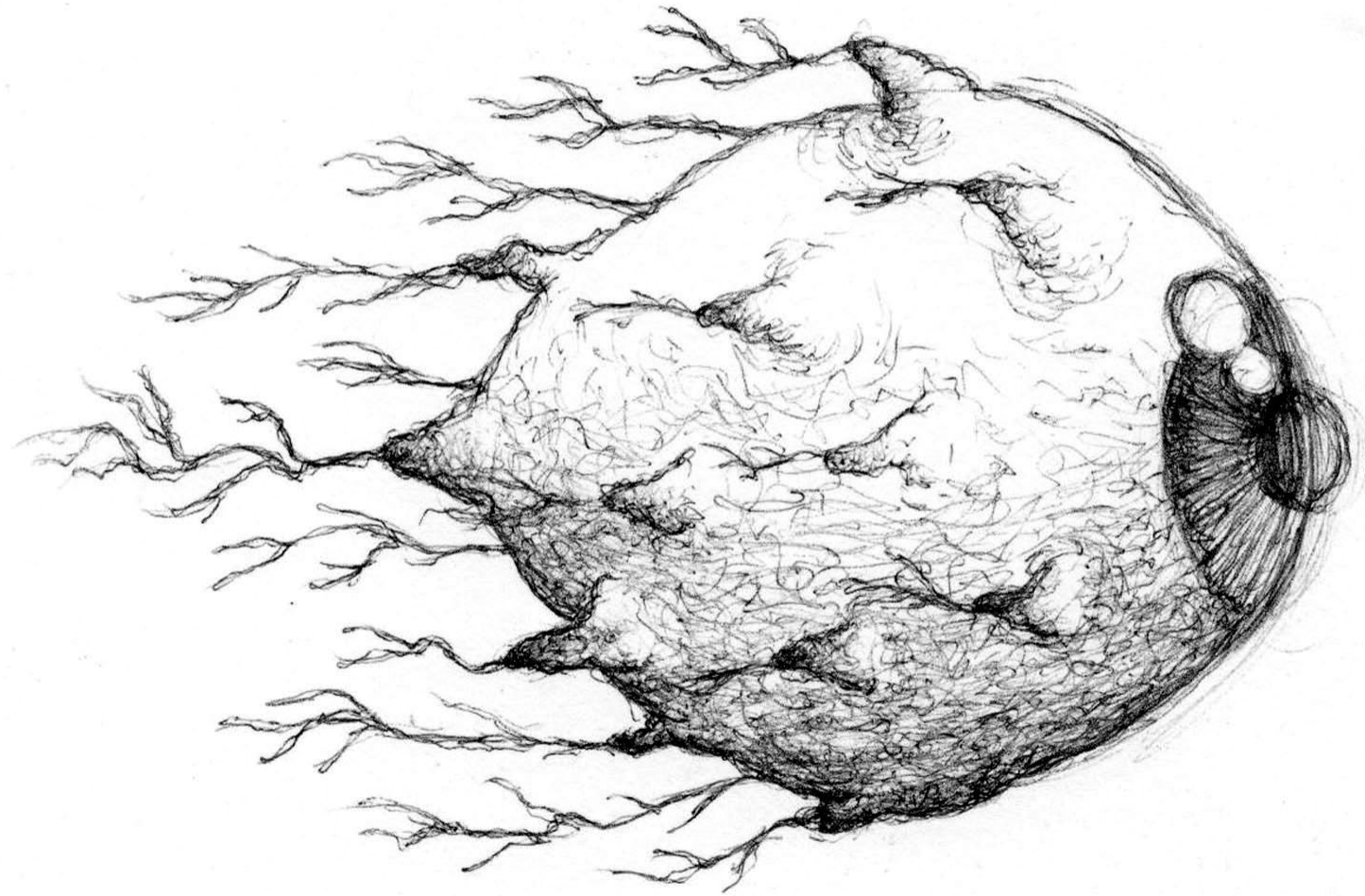

We have much more to accomplish and many new frontiers to explore, and we hope that our books will find a place (and a home) in your catalog.



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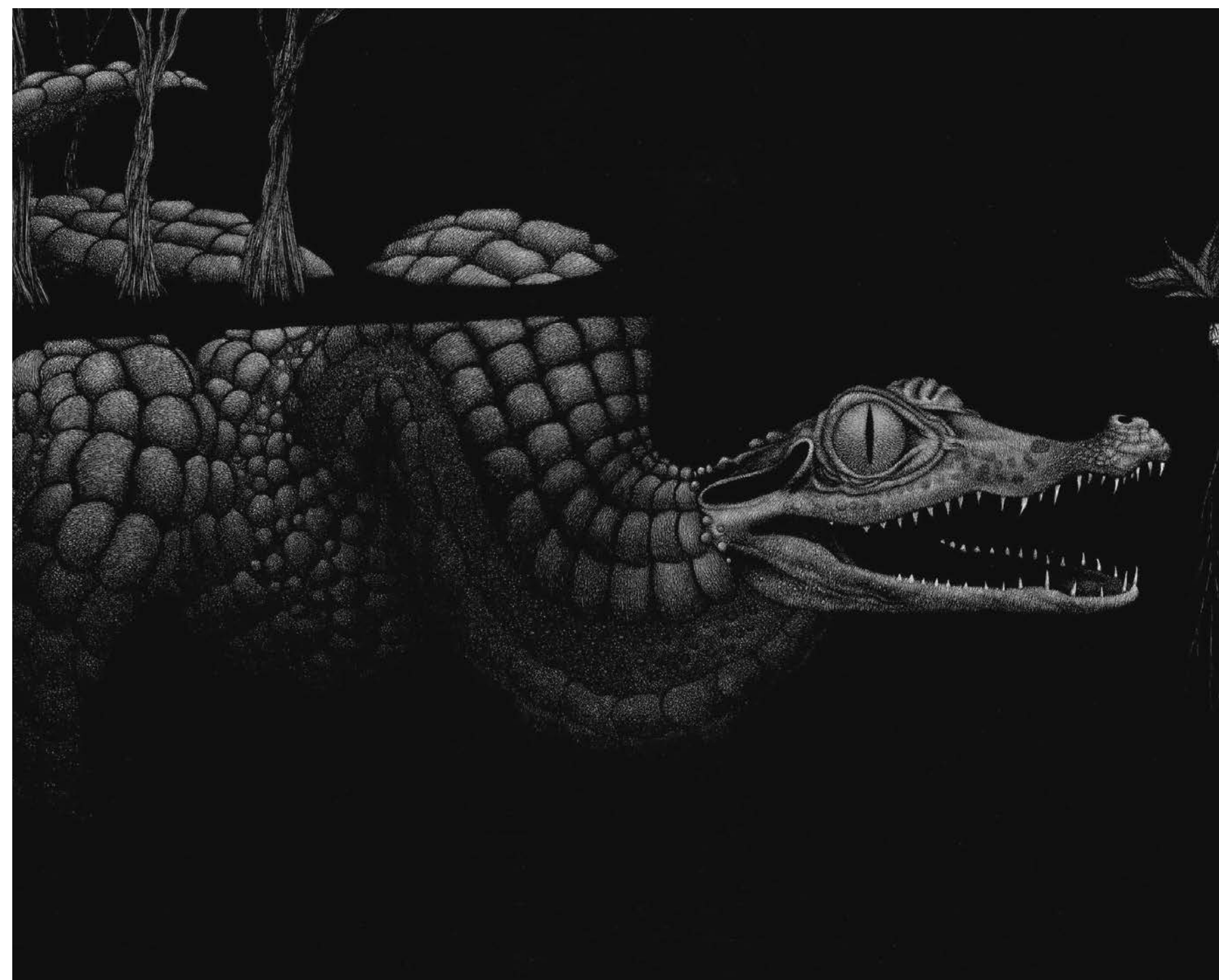
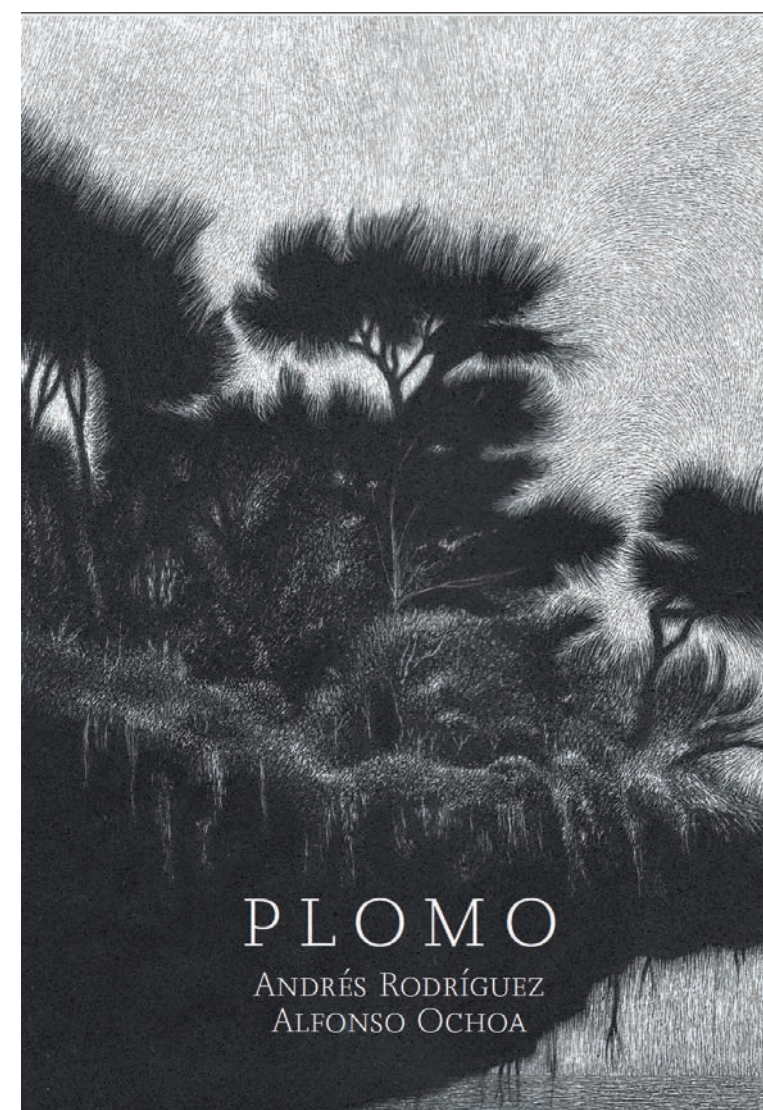

PEP CARRIÓ LIVES in Madrid. One day, he passed through Piedras Negras and collected stones that he dedicated himself to painting upon returning to his studio in Madrid. The interesting thing was that once painted, the stones began to speak. He told the story, but no one believed him. He didn't mind: let everyone believe what they want, of course.

MARÍA JOSÉ FERRADA lives in Santiago, Chile. When Pep shared the story of the stones, she took a plane and landed in Madrid. For a week, she listened to the conversations of the stones, with the help of a paper cone. They reminded her of the town of her childhood, which she still returns to whenever she can.

Me explico: padres y madres se anotaron a un sistema que recogía sus imágenes, tono de voz, patrones conductuales, expectativas y a partir de ahí, se creaba un holograma que se proyectaba desde el interior de un huevo fabricado con una mezcla de plástico y aluminio.

Escuchabas un *toc, toc* –señal de que el mini familiar te llamaba– lo abrías y se proyectaba la imagen de una madre de diez centímetros que, con la voz de siempre, te recordaba que te quería, que hicieras la tarea o que sacaras a pasear a tu mascota. También aparecía de vez en cuando algún padre o un abuelo. Pero eran las menos. En general los huevos guardaban madres.

El invento que buscaba disminuir nuestra soledad –alrededor de 2,140 habían dejado de existir los hermanos– fue divertido hasta que notamos que el huevo, al tiempo que proyectaba la imagen, nos espiaba.

Hackeamos el sistema liderados por una niña rusa de nueve años – Anoushka Rosakoff– e introdujimos en él imágenes falsas: niños estudiando, niños jugando con su mascota, niños comiendo comida saludable. Solo necesitabas enviar una foto de perfil y Anoushka Rosakoff hacía los demás, porque además de tener un ojo verde y otro azul, era listísima.

Nos descubrieron, claro. Pero fue un tiempo bonito. Días en que hicimos creer a los adultos en las familias perfectas; días en que ofendidos por el gesto de desconfianza, nadie hizo tareas; días en que todos los niños del mundo, sin importar nuestro país procedencia nos enamoramos por primera vez –para siempre– de esa niña llamada Anoushka Rosakoff.

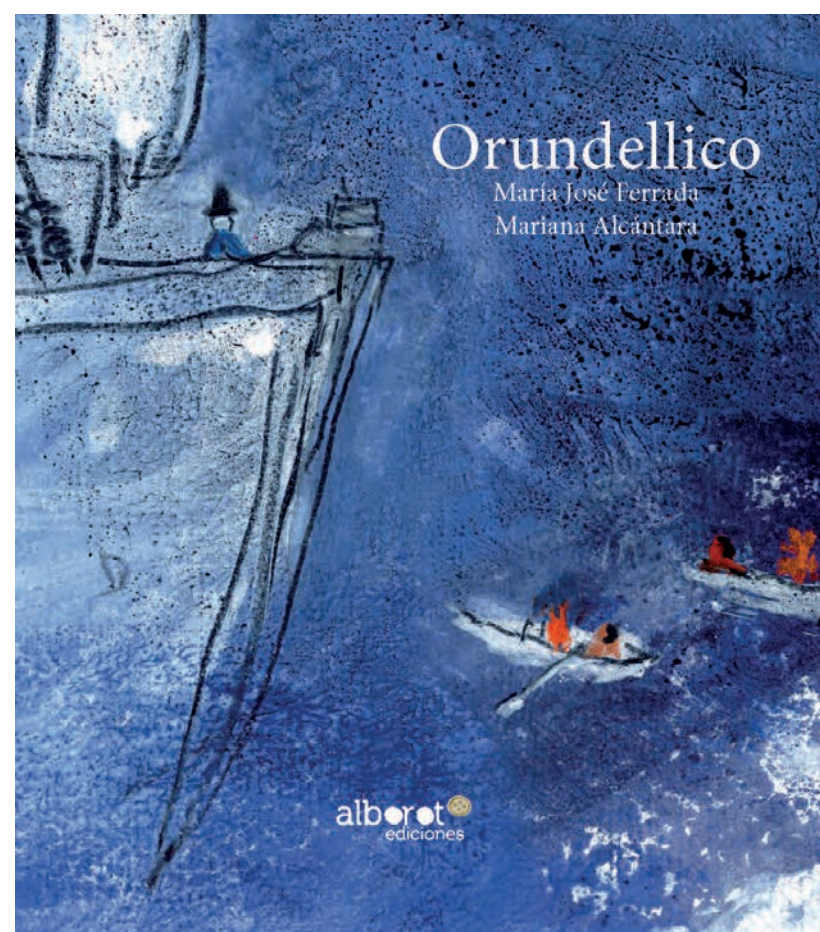

Orundellico

We know from the diaries of Captain FitzRoy and Charles Darwin the story of Orundellico (1815–1864), a Yaghan boy from Tierra del Fuego, who, along with three other Fuegians, was taken to England aboard a ship called the Beagle. Captain FitzRoy—who gave the boy a button in exchange for him—had the idea to educate him in the customs, language, and religion of his country, with the intention that, upon his return, Orundellico would share what he had learned. There is no record of what this experience meant to Orundellico. This book is a tribute to what we believe could have been his version.

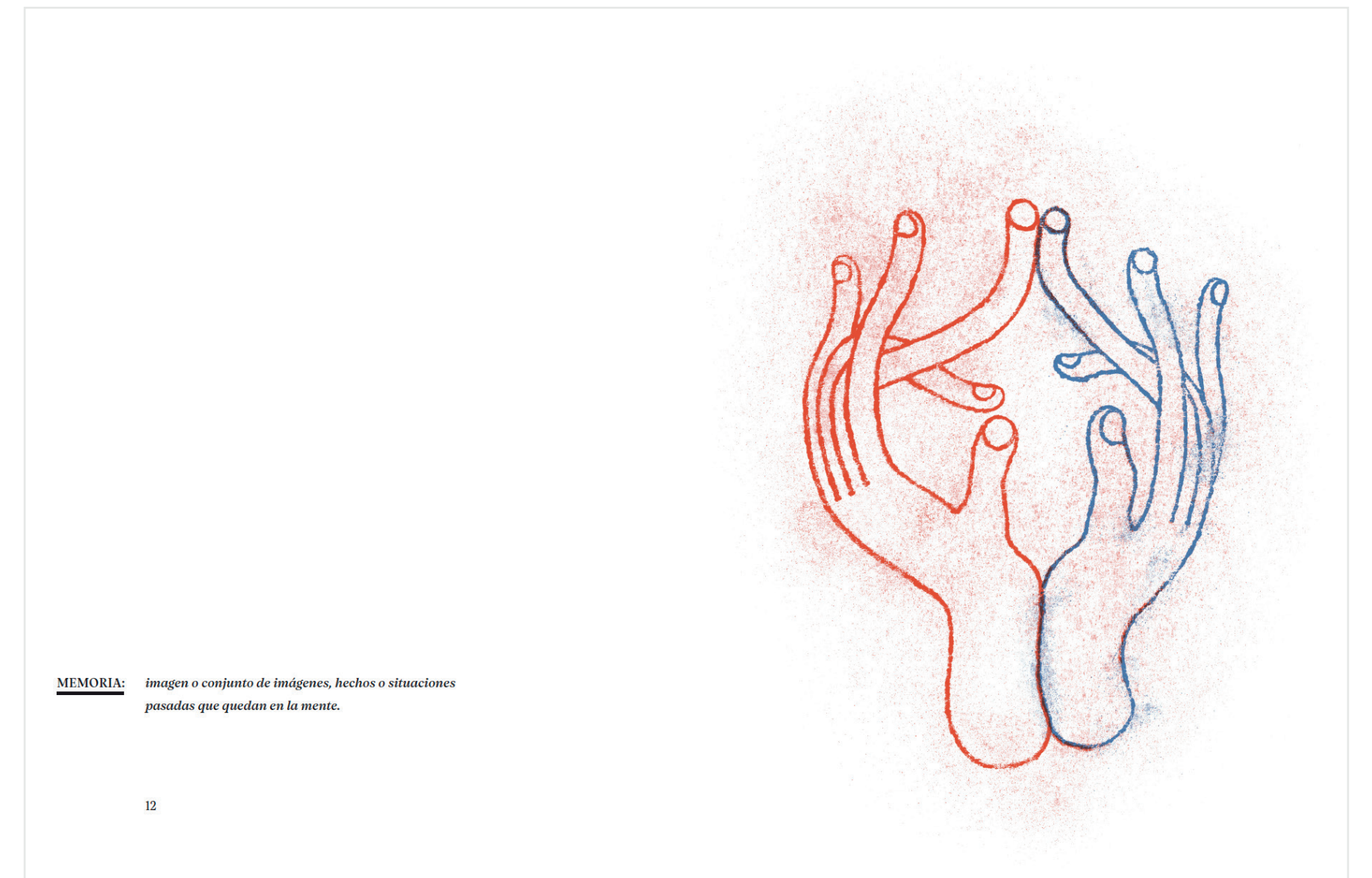
MARTÍN LEÓN BARRETO

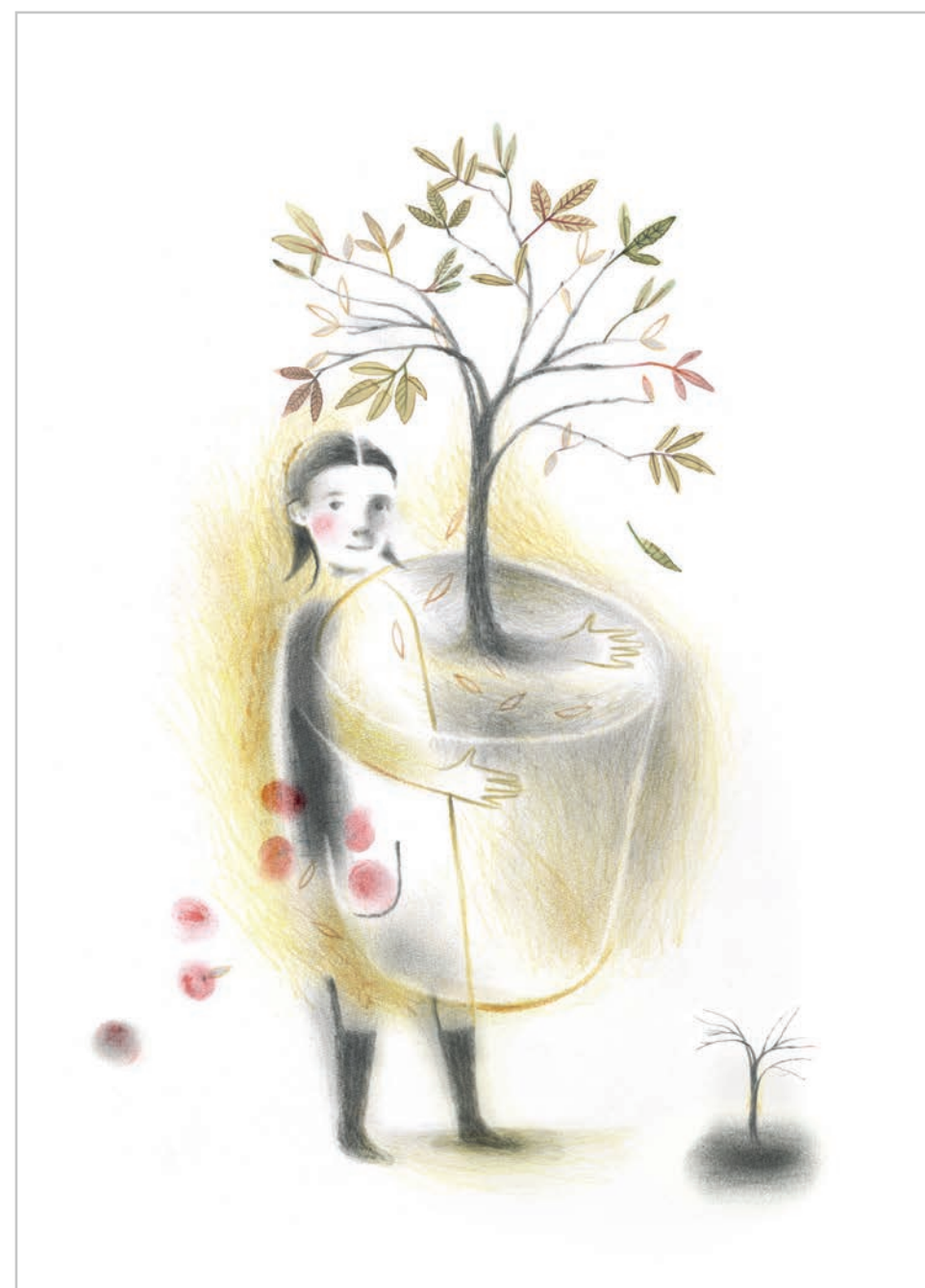
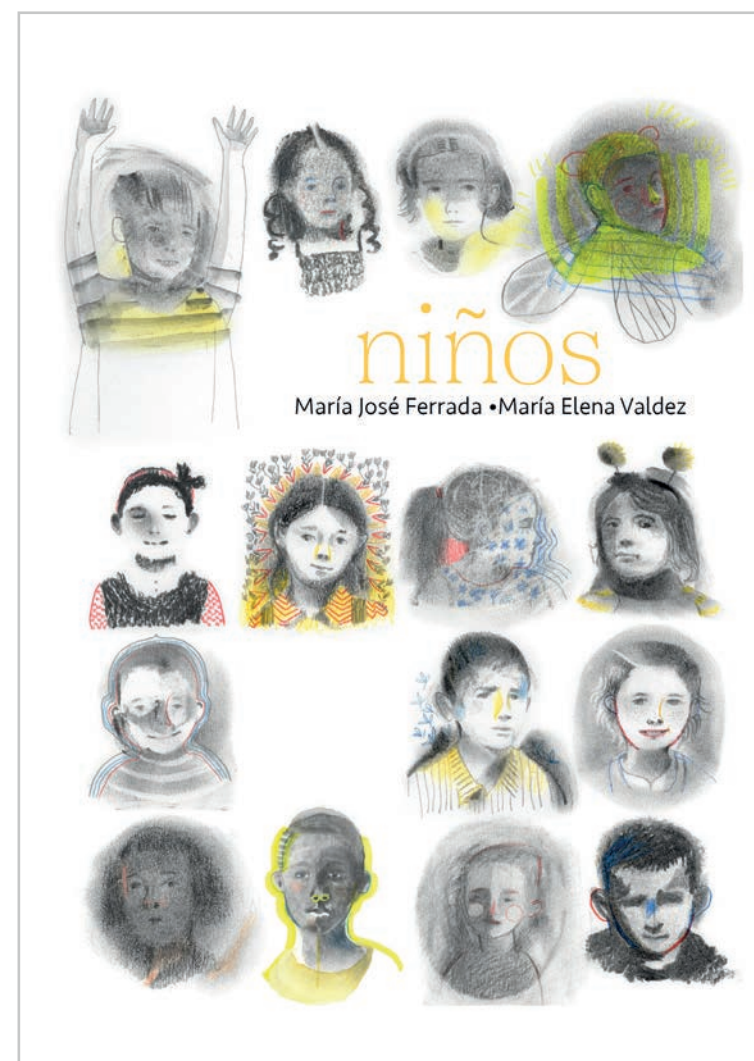

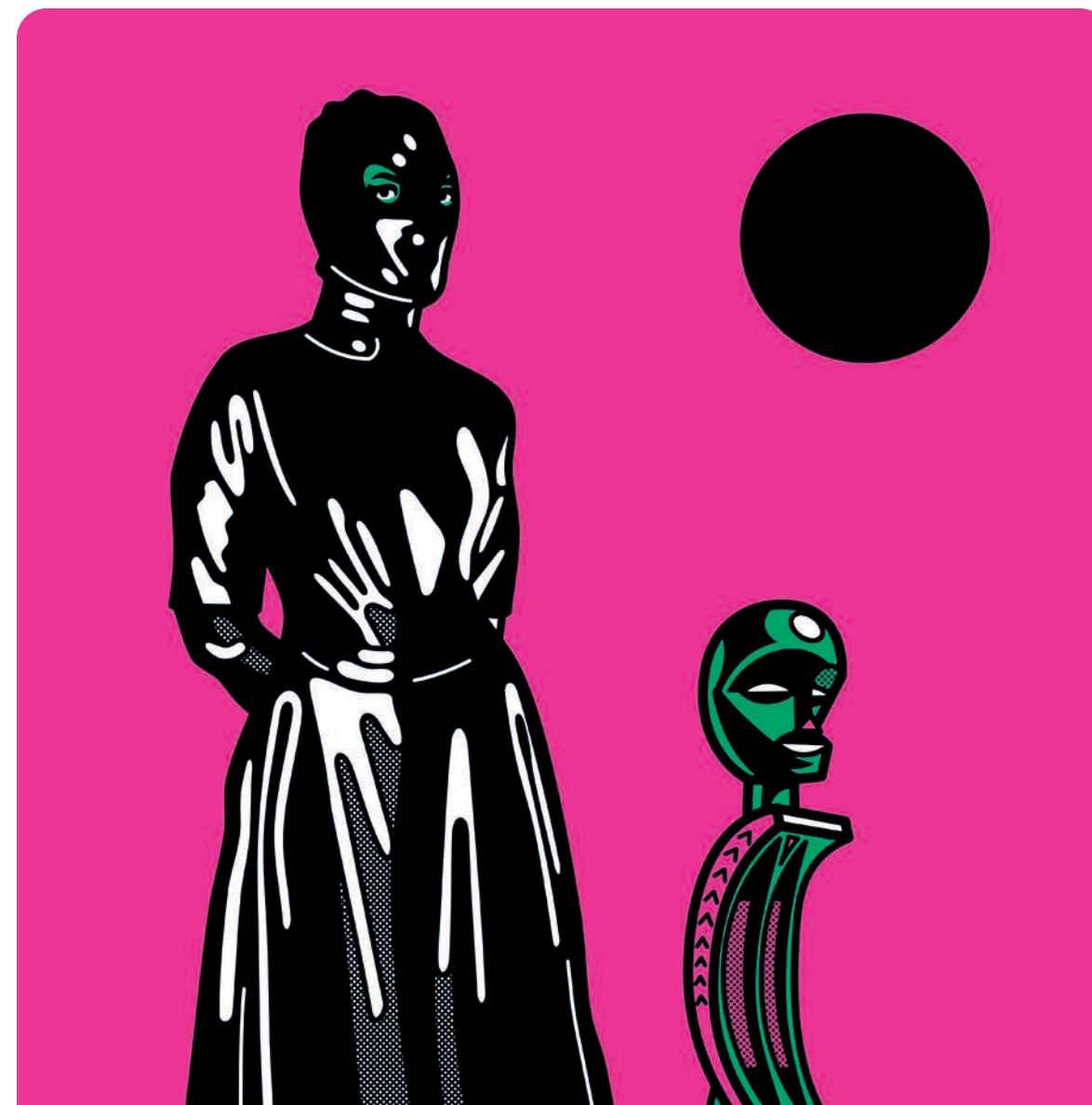


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MARÍA ELENA VALDEZ

She employs white space not only as a fundamental means to balance her compositions but also transforms it into a stage where characters move and stories unfold. For example, the non-linear narrative of the illustrations in the book *Nadadores*, where, according to The New York Times, the shapes support the idea that water is a playground outside the real world, thus creating a fluid dialogue between images and words.

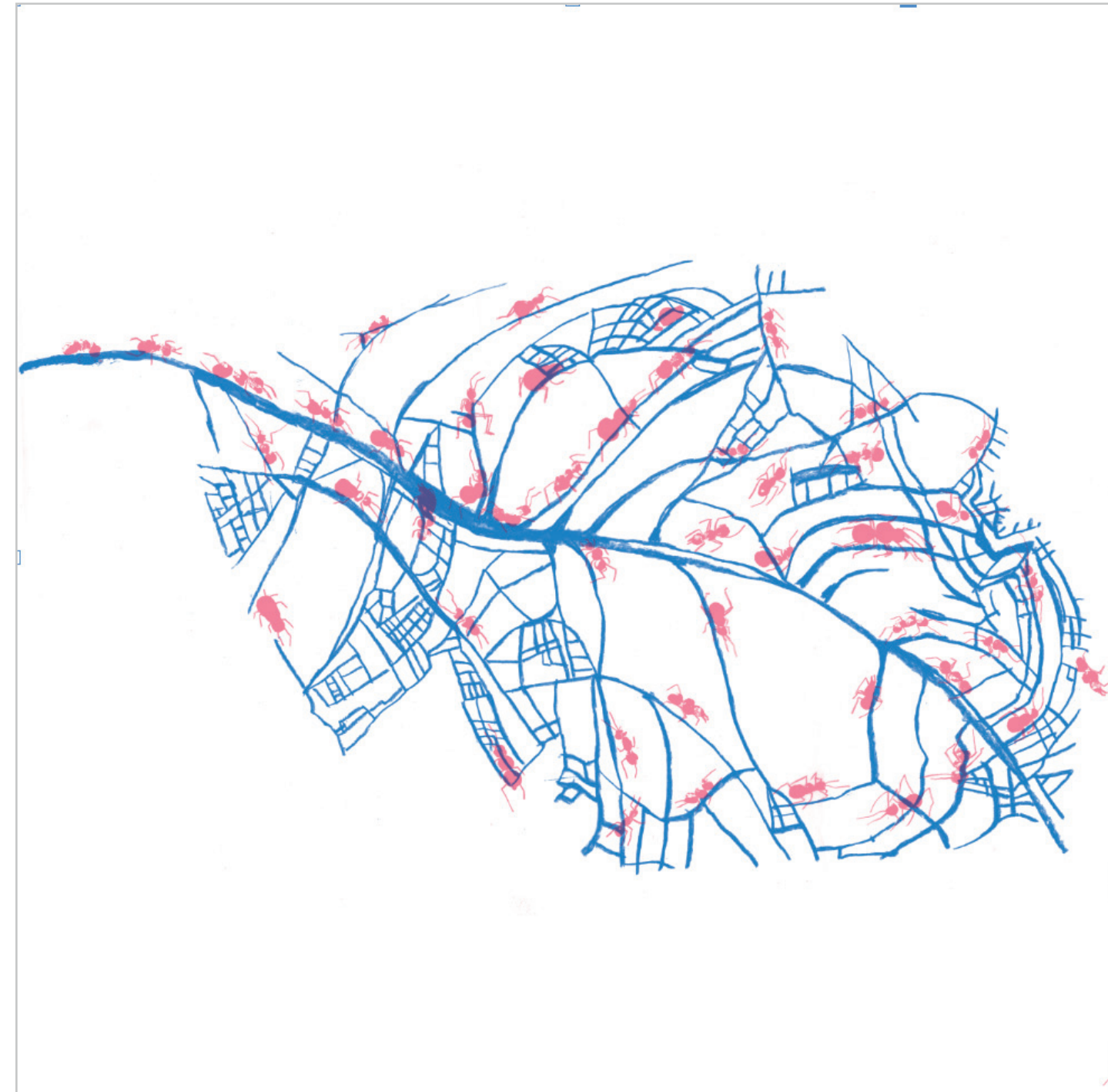
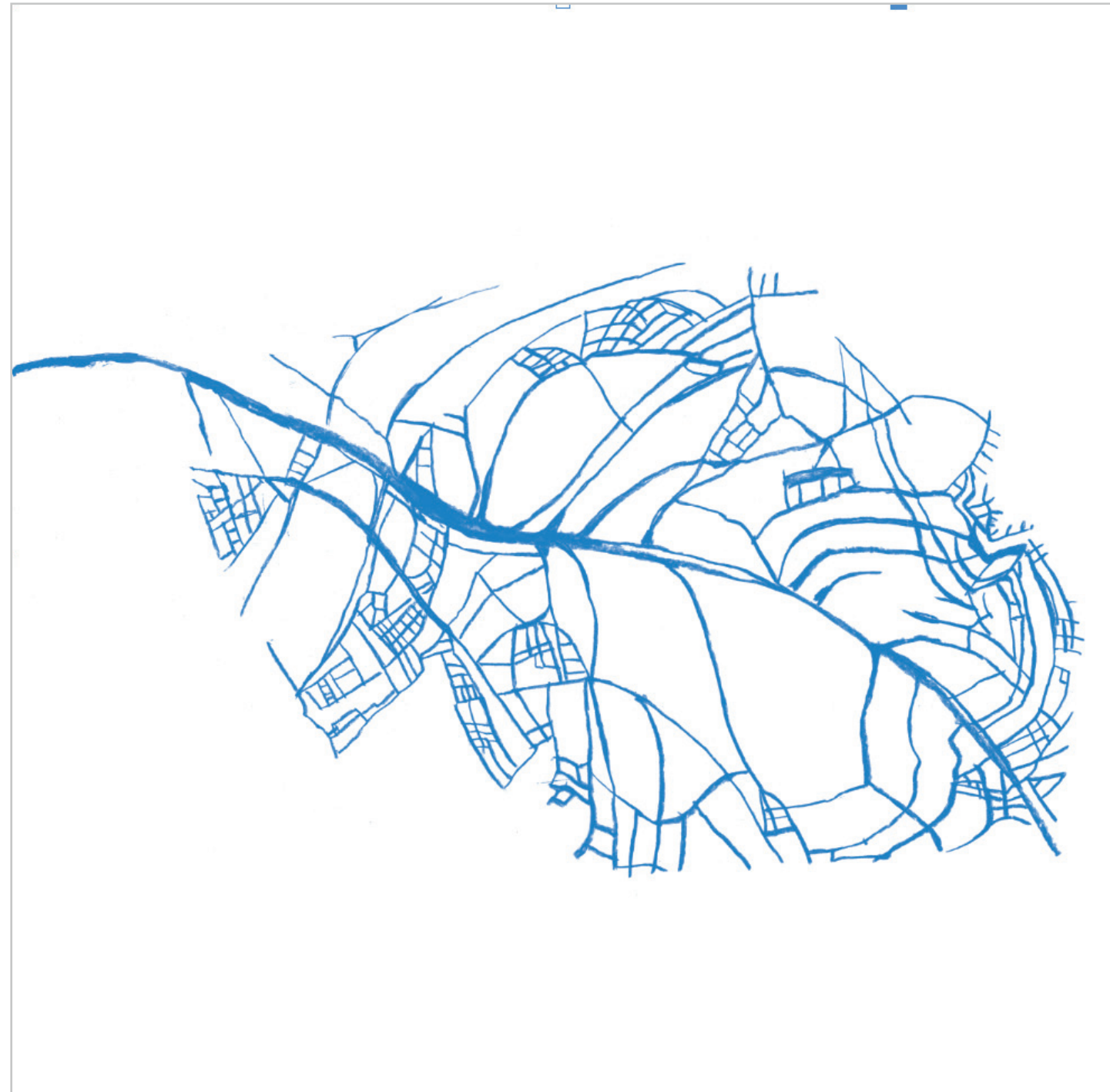
Stop and look—and look again.

At first glance, each illustration appears to be mostly white space surrounding a single monochromatic image painted in deep blue. But hold it up to the light, and an intricate magenta underlay appears. Suddenly, simple branches are full of hidden birds, bugs, and butterflies. Bears and squirrels roam through previously barren woods. This striking effect is accomplished by thin, doubled pages connected at their outer edges. The blue artwork is printed on the front, while the magenta layer sits on a sheet behind it, just dark enough to show through.

It is an amazing book that invites the reader to discover nature in a poetic way.

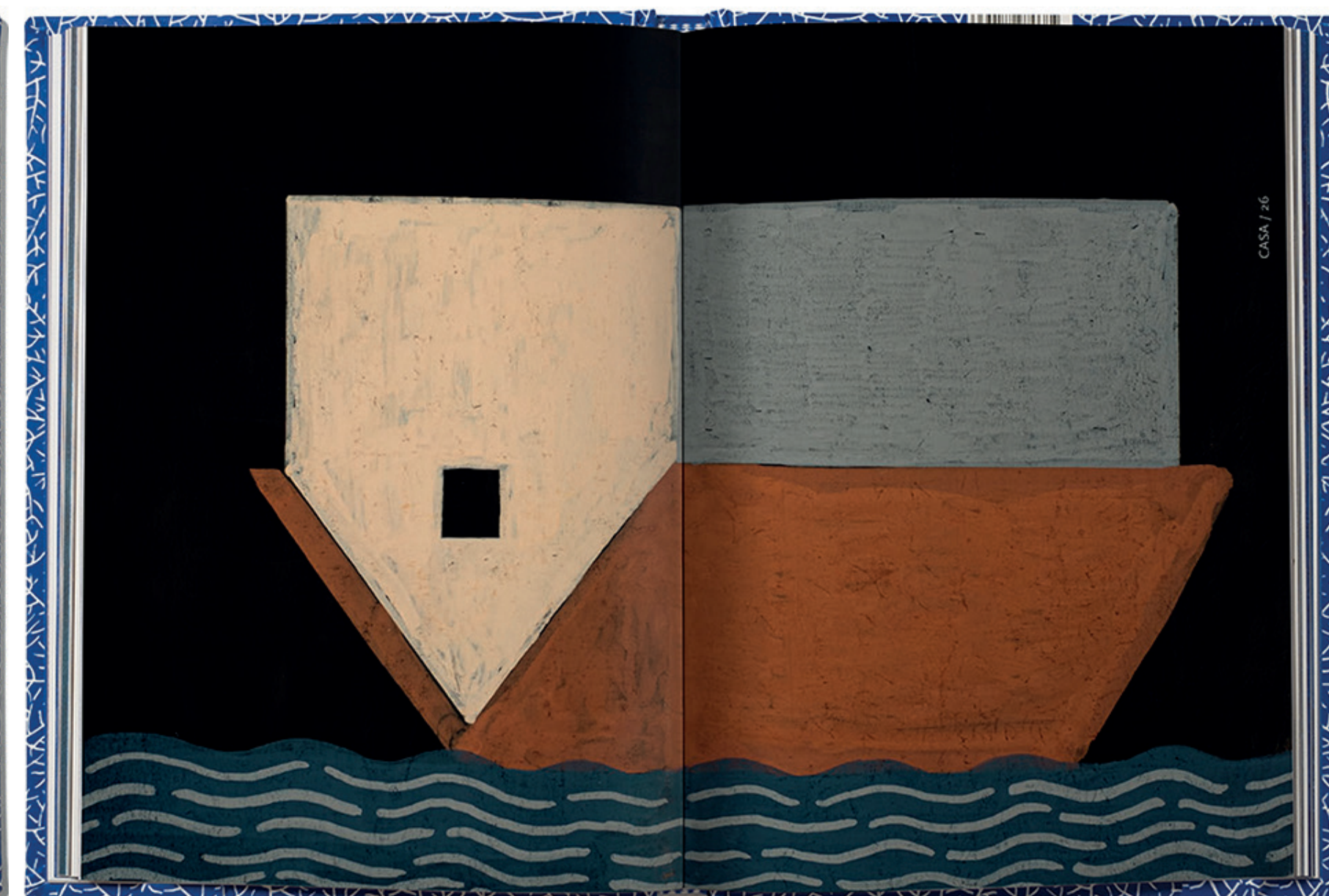
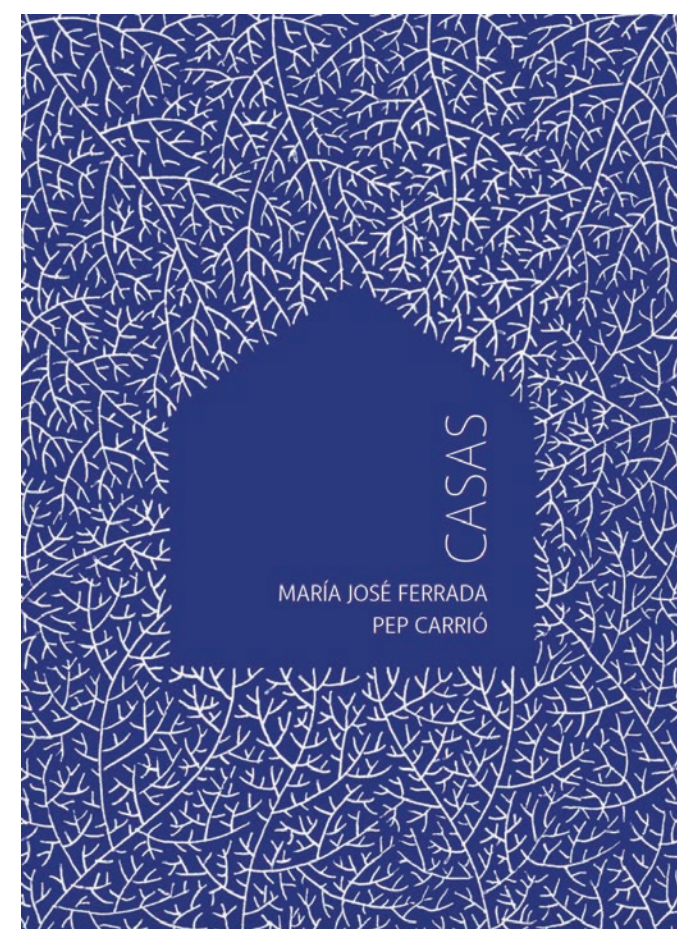

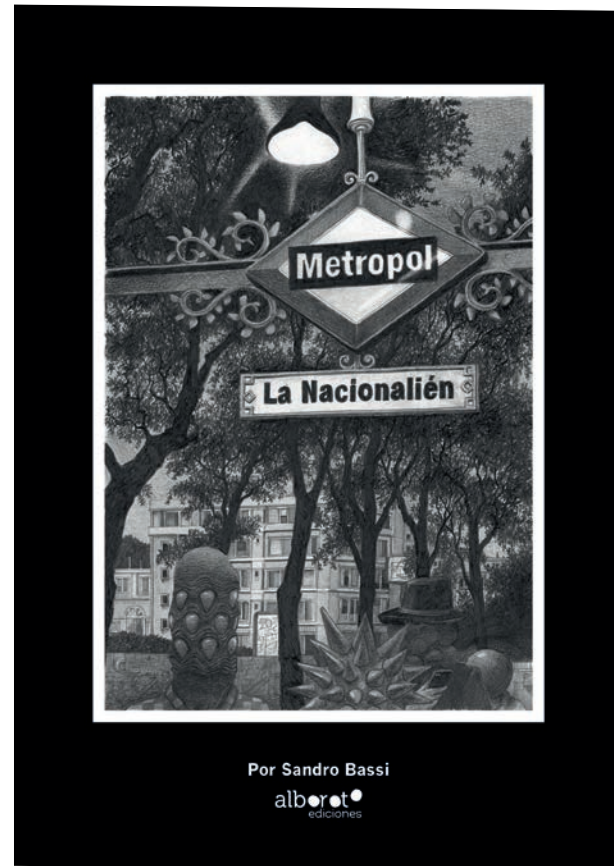

PEP CARRIÓ lives in an apartment in Madrid, where he studies the passage of time. He is especially interested in calendars (time measured on sheets of paper) and believes that, particularly if they have black covers, they are too wonderful an invention to fill with meetings and phone numbers. Instead, he fills them with drawings: drawings of trees that grow underground, drawings of islands that rise from the sea, and drawings of houses inhabited by birds—every day.

MARÍA JOSÉ FERRADA lives in an apartment in Santiago de Chile. When she heard about Pep Carrió's calendars, she bought one and said, "I will create a story every day." However, the following week, she lost her calendar. She continued to write on napkins, which she also forgot in the café around the corner from her house. The good thing is that every December, Hugo, the waiter, gives her an envelope containing everything she wrote during the year. The system is somewhat elaborate, but according to her, it works.

An artist from Venezuela debuts a wordless picture book in which creatures are obsessed with their mobile phones.

At first glance, the characters appear to be, as the title suggests, extraterrestrials. Bipedal figures have oversized heads, each unique—sporting spikes, cubes, bulbous growths, geometric shapes, an elephantine trunk, an upside-down cone, or tentacles. Closer inspection reveals light-skinned human bodies dressed in contemporary winter clothing. The juxtaposition of some bare human arms with the heads raises questions about these travelers, who pass through a railway station, then board an underground train. The station is named “La Nacionalien.”

SANDRO BASSI is an illustrator and plastic artist. However, his creative path has grown around a career in advertising from which he draws to enrich his plastic and conceptual language.

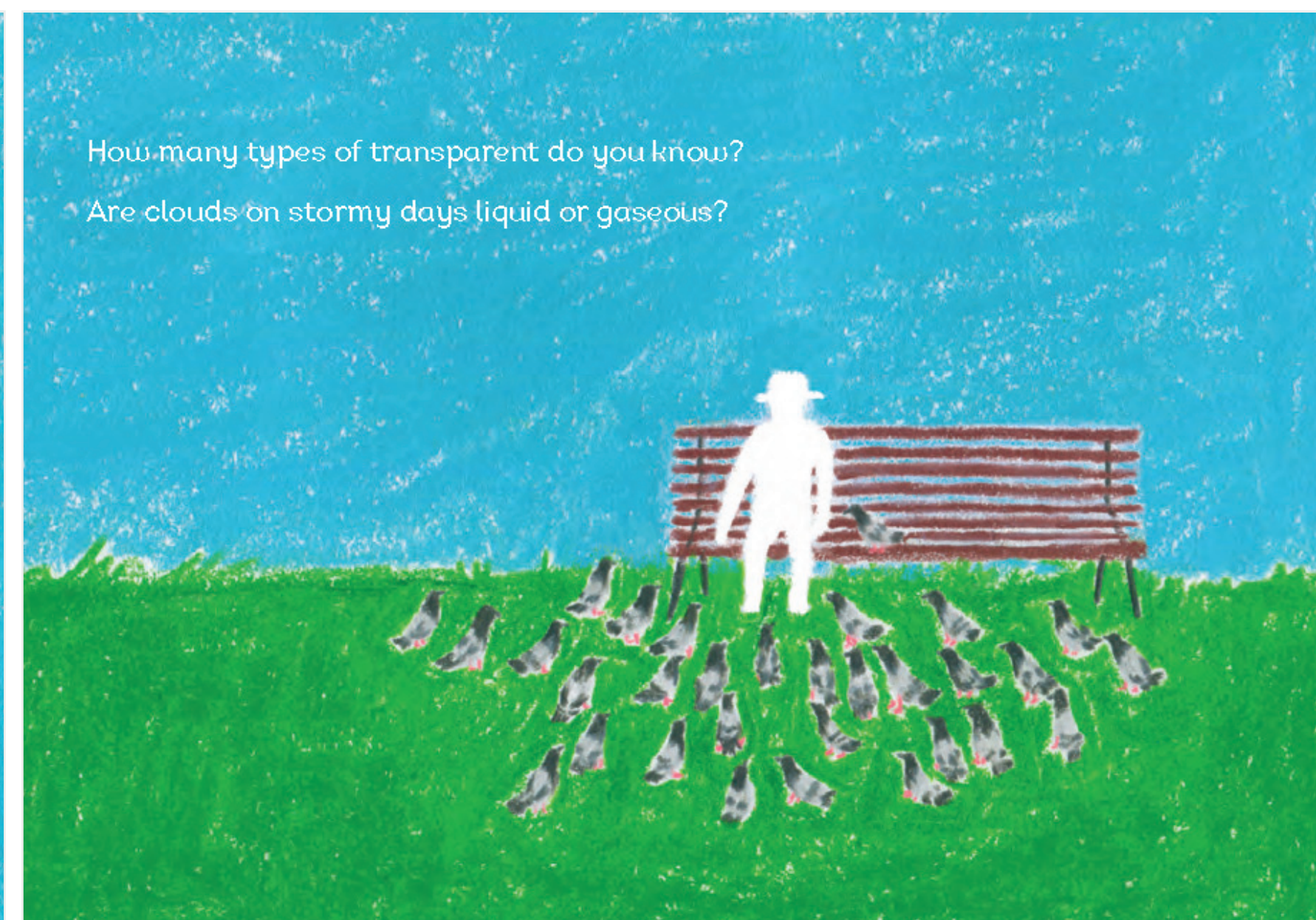
Images of real life situations, environments loaded with graphic details and characters, display the identity of the big and crowded cities.

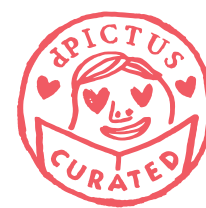
