

His first book for Tate, *Mildred the Gallery Cat*, was shortlisted for the Klaus Flugge Prize (2023), and has been translated into three languages.




THE SUN AND THE RHINO


Sharna Jackson is an award-winning, bestselling author and Artistic Director who creates work for children and young people.




